

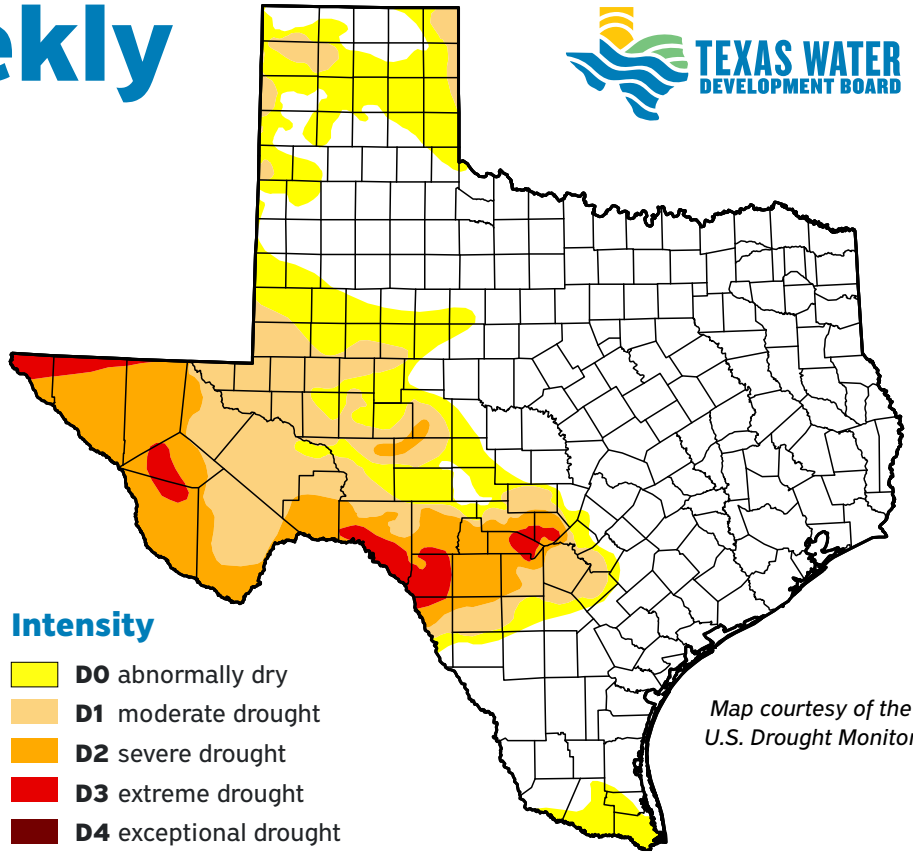

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of June 25 shows a large area of improvement in South Texas compliments of Tropical Storm Alberto, which made landfall in Mexico on June 20. Rains associated with Alberto brought Texas our largest one-week decrease in drought area in five months.



Drought conditions

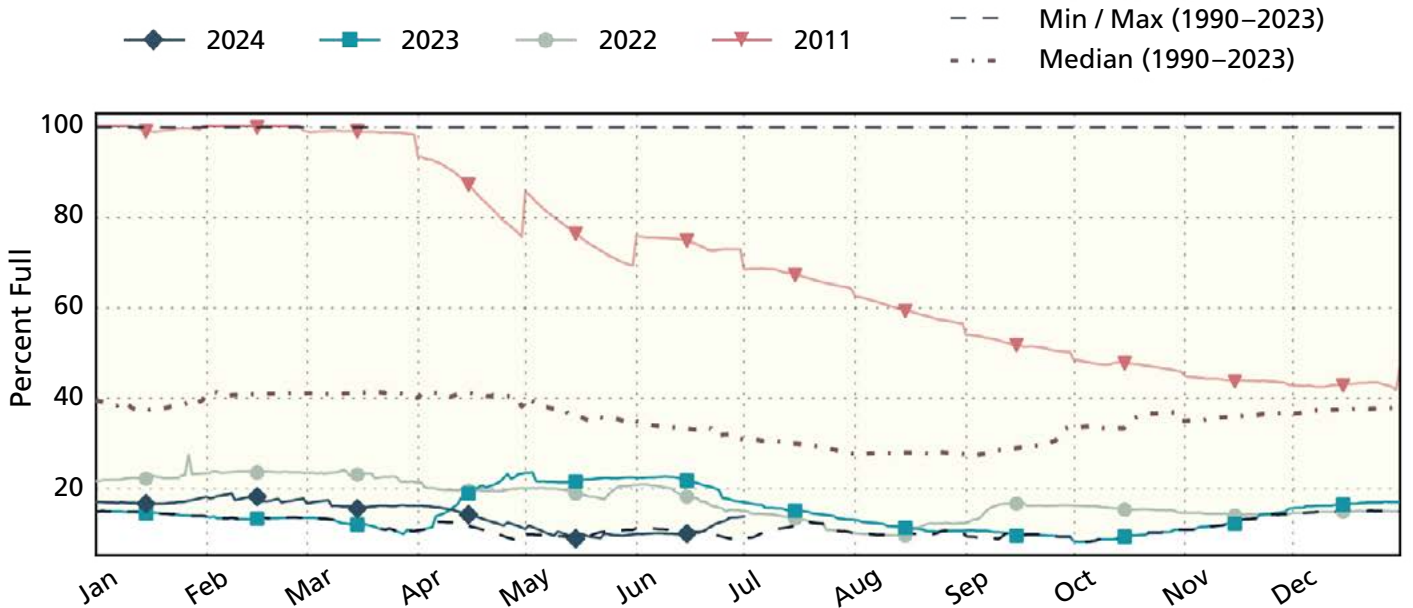
- 25% now

Intensity

- D0 abnormally dry
- D1 moderate drought
- D2 severe drought
- D3 extreme drought
- D4 exceptional drought

Lake Falcon storage

Moisture from Tropical Storm Alberto helped storage in Lake Falcon in South Texas increase 3.5 percentage points in the last two weeks, the largest two-week increase since April 2023. However, the lake needs more help because storage remains almost 20 percentage points less than normal for the time of year.
