

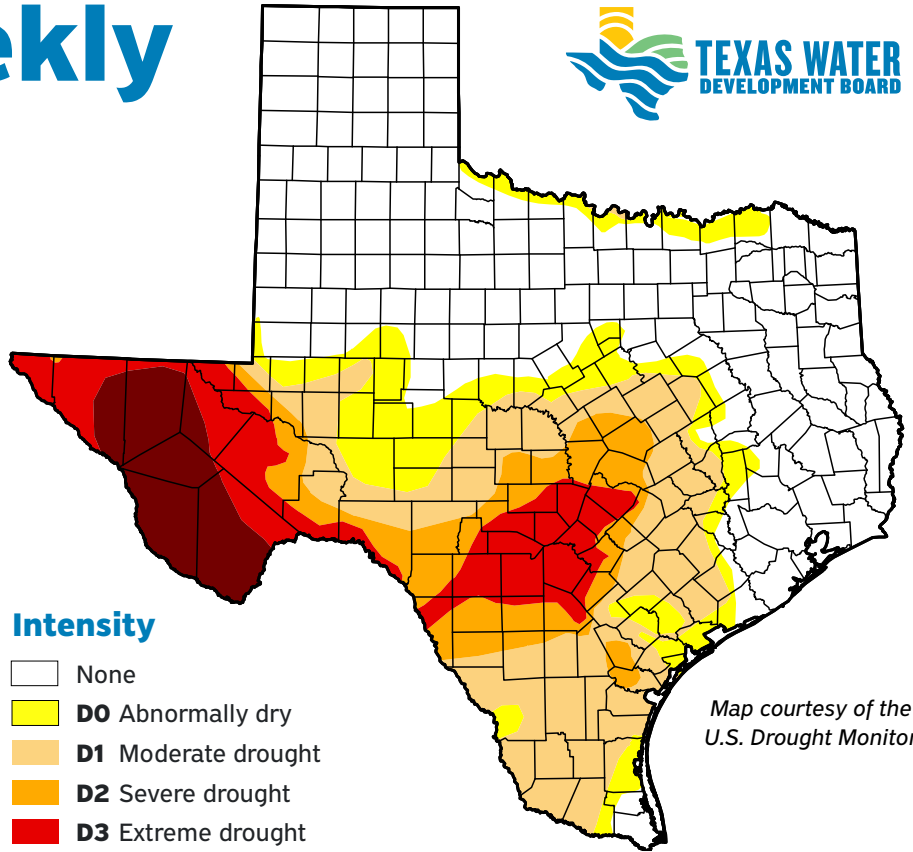

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of January 28 shows little change from the previous week. Rainfall recorded on the last few days of January may bring some improvement to next week's map. But most of the precipitation fell in areas already free of drought, reducing potential benefit.

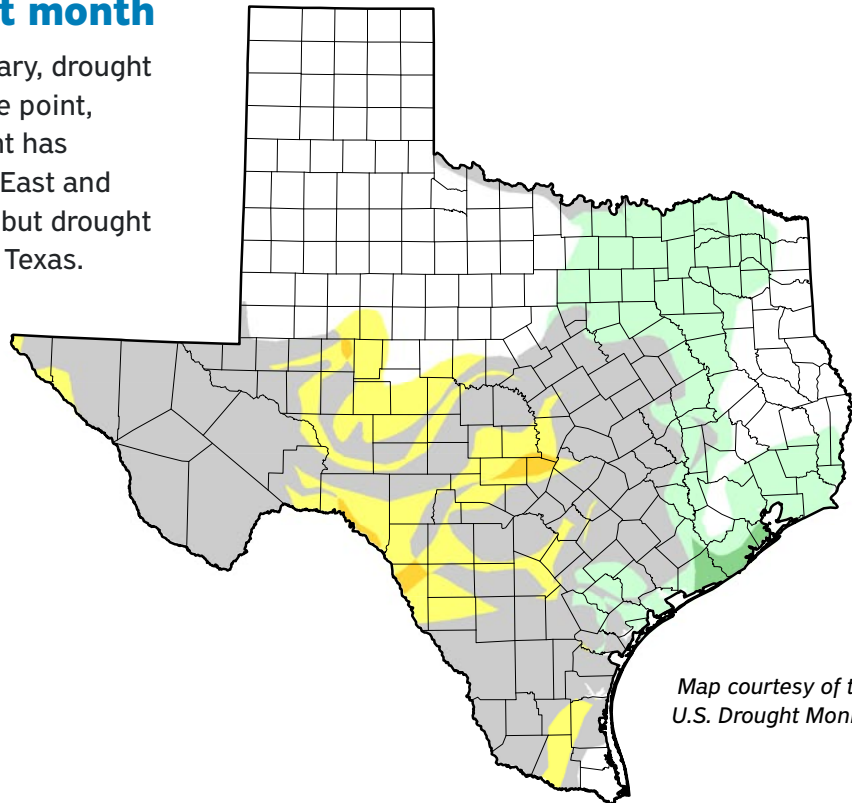

Drought change in the last month

From the end of December to late January, drought area in Texas contracted one percentage point, the third consecutive month that drought has contracted. Most of the Panhandle, and East and North Texas are now free from drought, but drought has expanded and intensified in Central Texas.
