

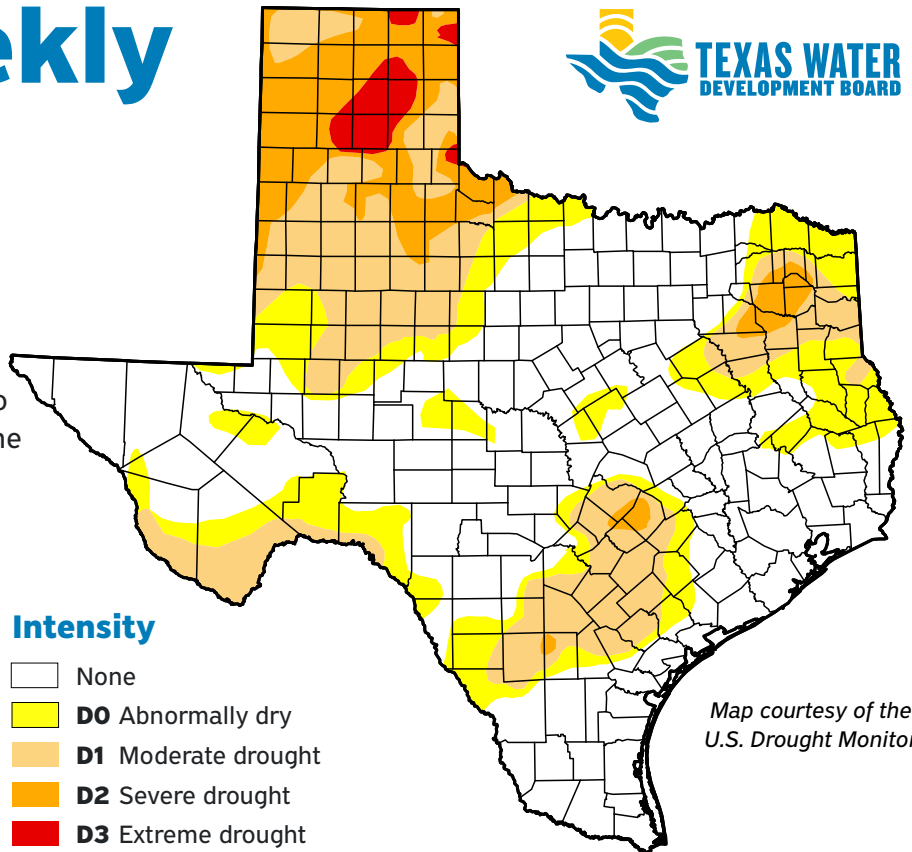

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of July 7 shows improvement in parts of the Panhandle but degradation in parts of Central Texas. This time of year, one or two thunderstorm tracks a month can determine whether an area recovers from drought or falls further into drought.

23% a year ago

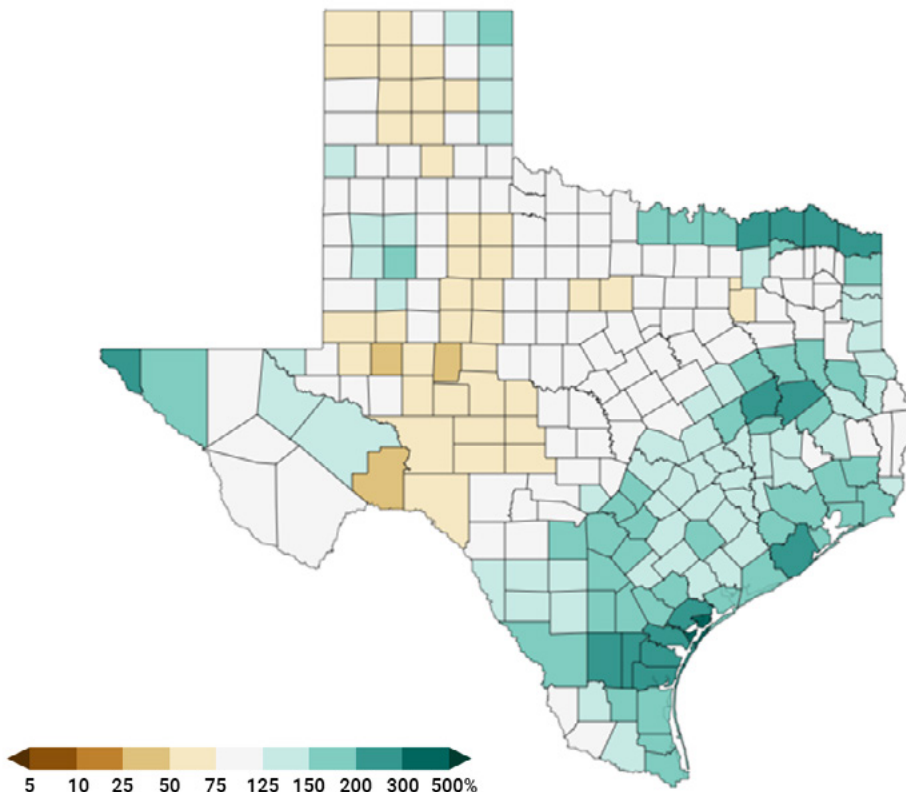
Intensity

Statewide, June 2026 precipitation was 3.51 inches, almost 125 percent of the average for the month from 1901 to 2000—but conditions varied widely. Aransas County along the coast recorded three times its normal precipitation. Meanwhile, Midland, Sterling, and Terrell counties in West Texas received less than half of their normal precipitation.
