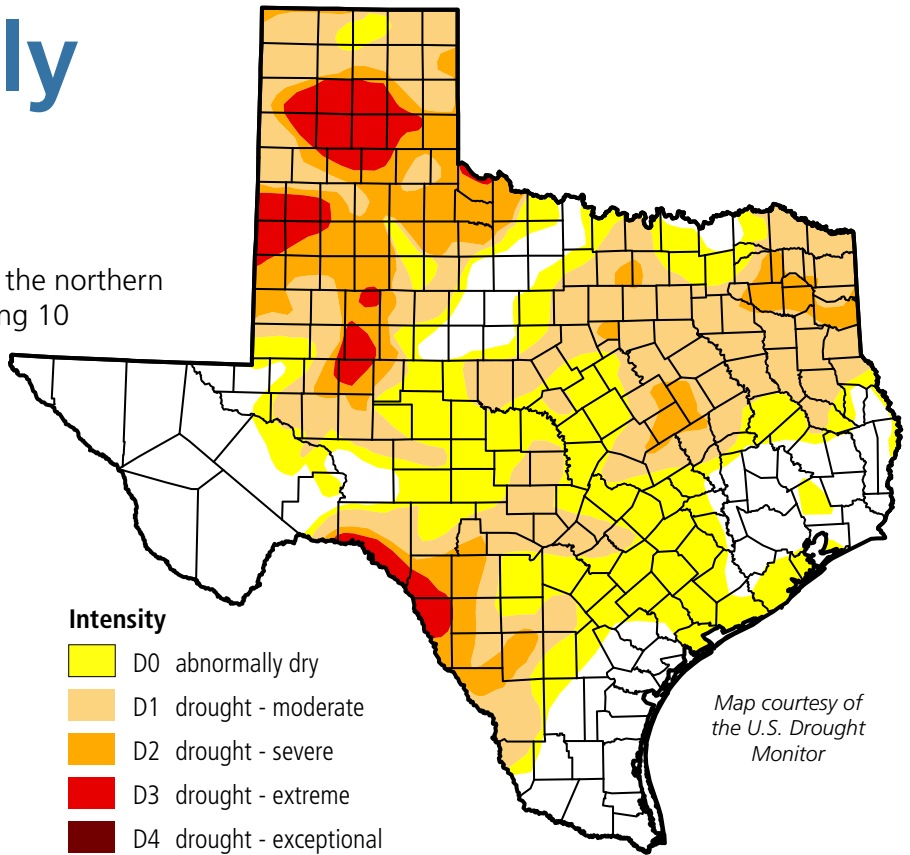

## Water conditions

Recent rains improved drought conditions in the northern Panhandle and along the coast. After receiving 10 inches of rain, areas near Brownsville and Corpus Christi went from severe drought to completely out of drought on the most recent drought map. Drought continued to intensify in other areas of the state.

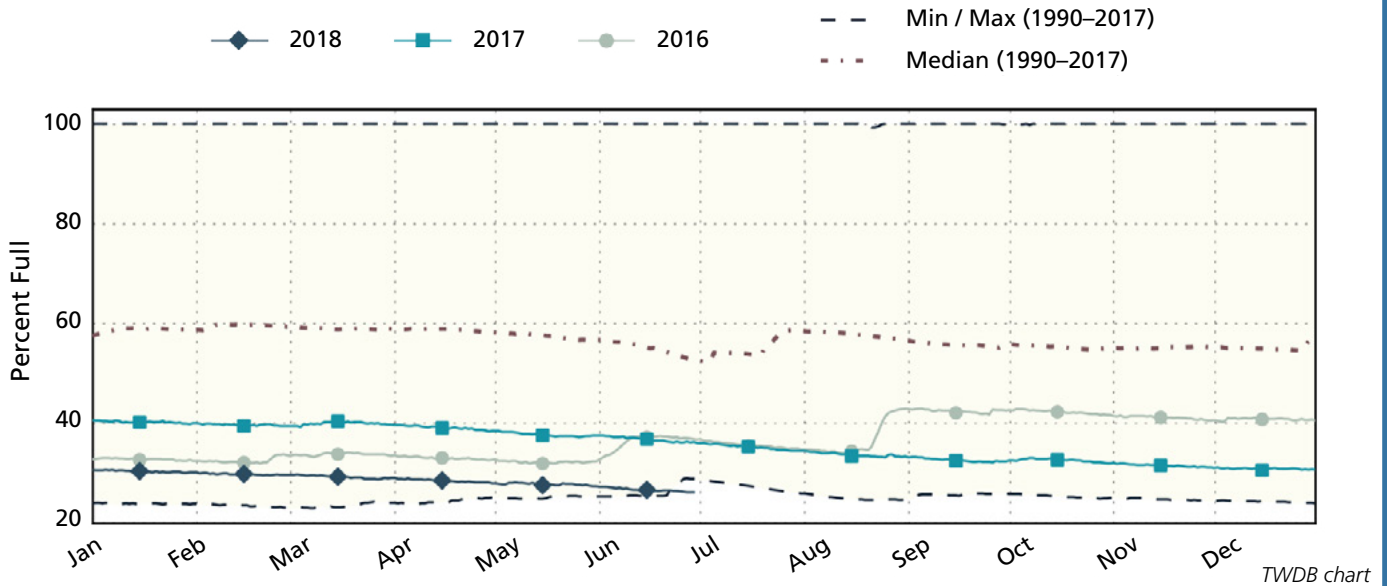
## Drought conditions

## Choke Canyon Reservoir storage hydrograph

Recent rains were too far east to improve conditions in Choke Canyon Reservoir west of Corpus Christi. This reservoir, which supplies water to Corpus Christi, is now at 26 percent of capacity, its lowest level at the end of June since the reservoir filled for the first time in 1987.
