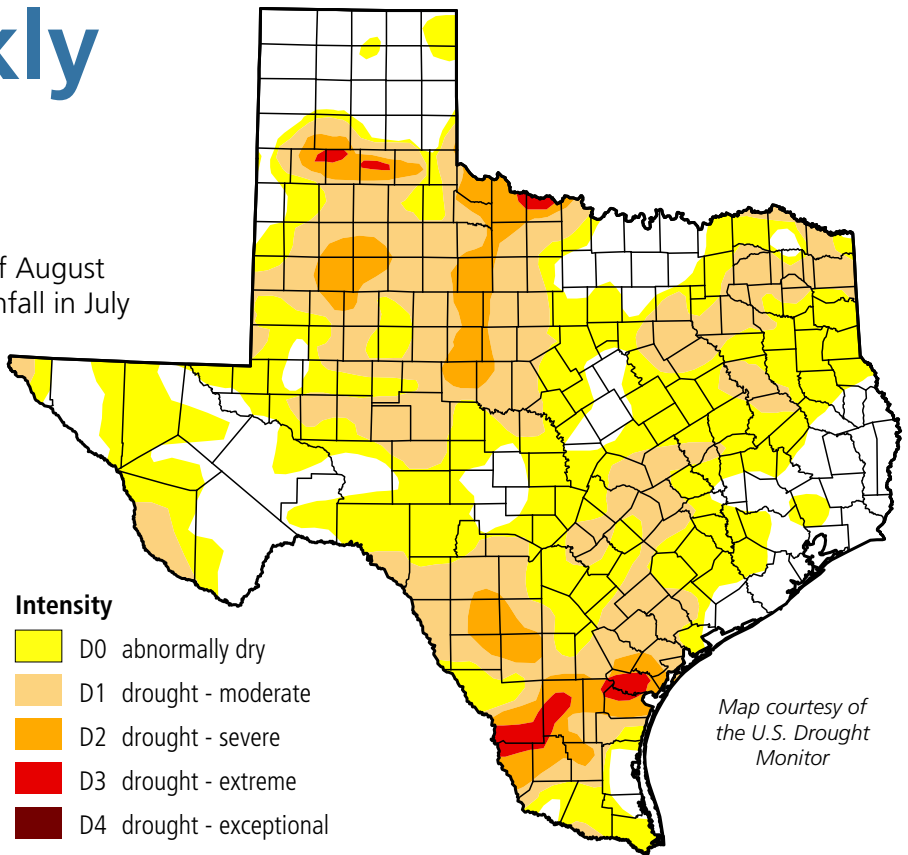

## Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of August 27 shows the impact of below-average rainfall in July and August. Moderate or worse drought impacts 38 percent of the state. Another 36 percent of the state is abnormally dry and could transition to drought in coming weeks.

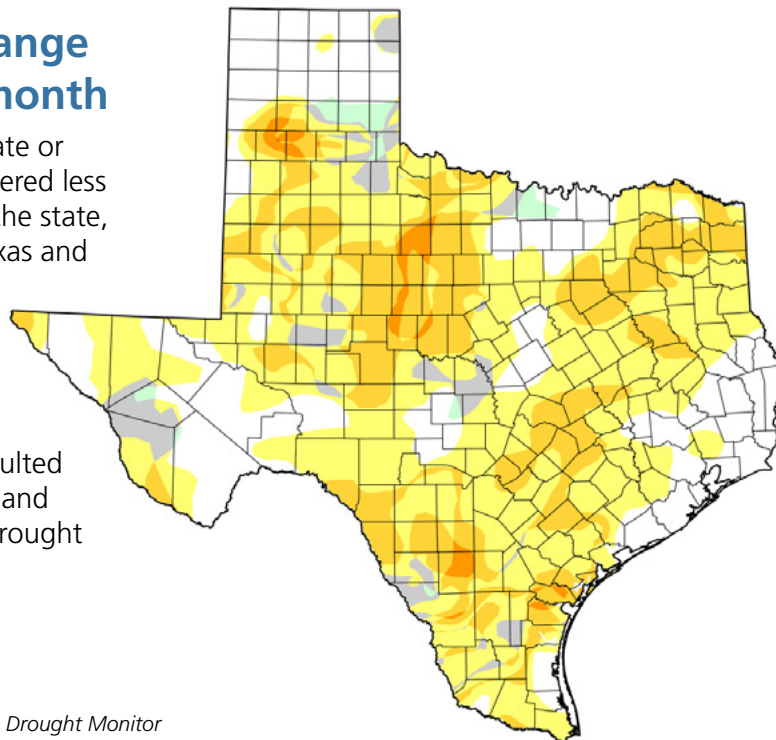
## Drought conditions

- ◆ 38% now
- ◆ 32% a week ago
- ◆ 0.2% three months ago
- ◆ 62% a year ago



## Drought change in the last month

In late July, moderate or worse drought covered less than 5 percent of the state, mostly in South Texas and along the upper Red River Valley. In August, hot temperatures and continued below-average rainfall resulted in rapid expansion and intensification of drought across the state.
