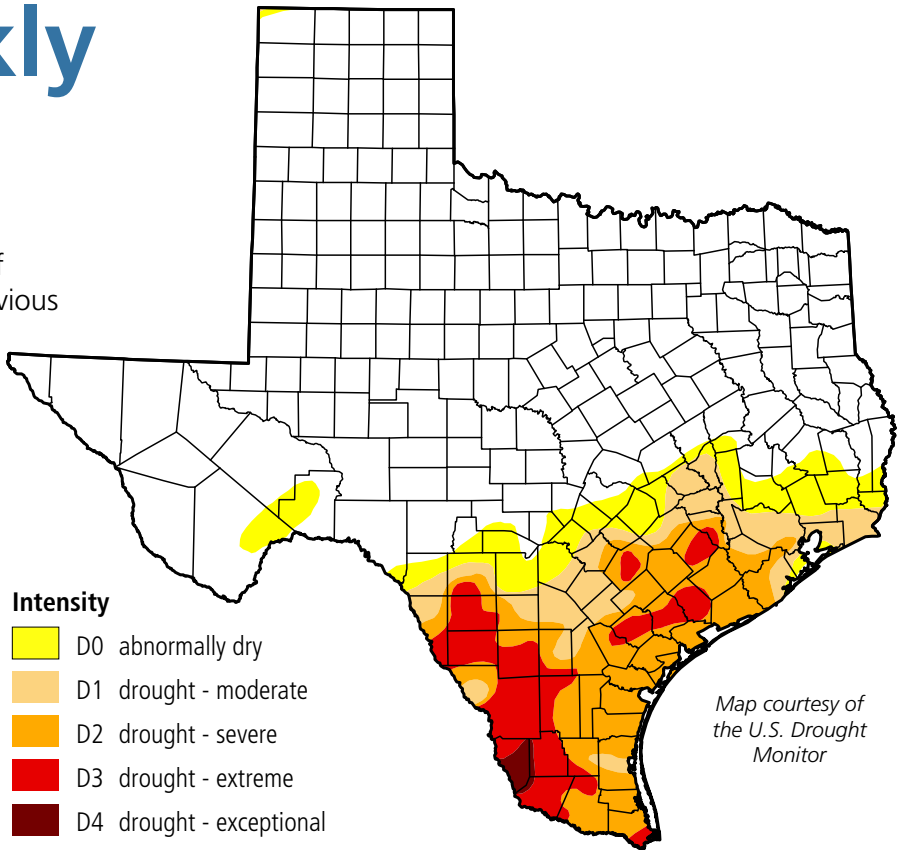

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of March 31 shows little change from the previous week. The area of the state impacted by moderate or worse drought remains at 20 percent. Extreme or worse drought is up one percentage point and now covers 5 percent of the state.

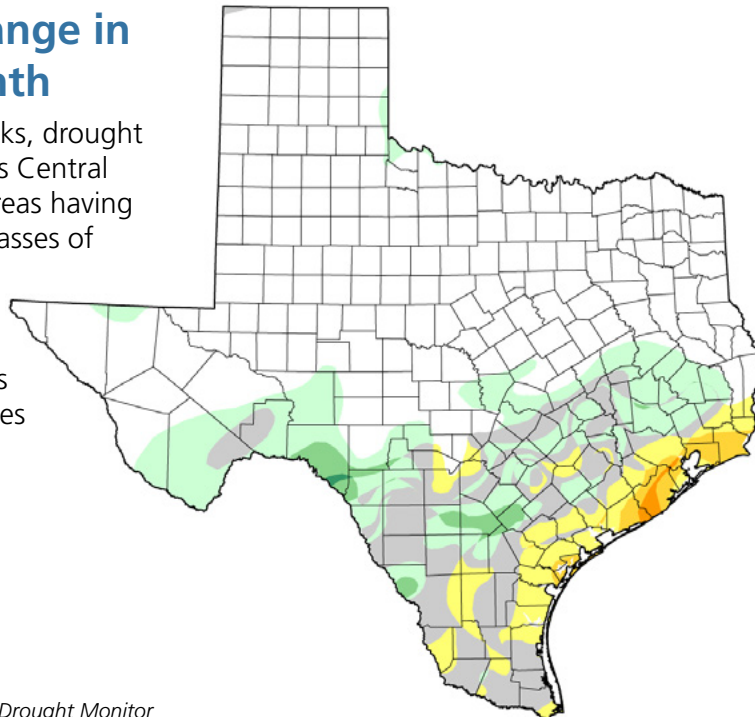
Drought conditions

- ◆ 20% now
- ◆ 20% a week ago
- ◆ 36% three months ago
- ◆ 12% a year ago



Drought change in the last month

In the last four weeks, drought has improved across Central Texas, with some areas having as much as three classes of improvement. Meanwhile, areas along the coast have experienced as much as three classes of degradation.
