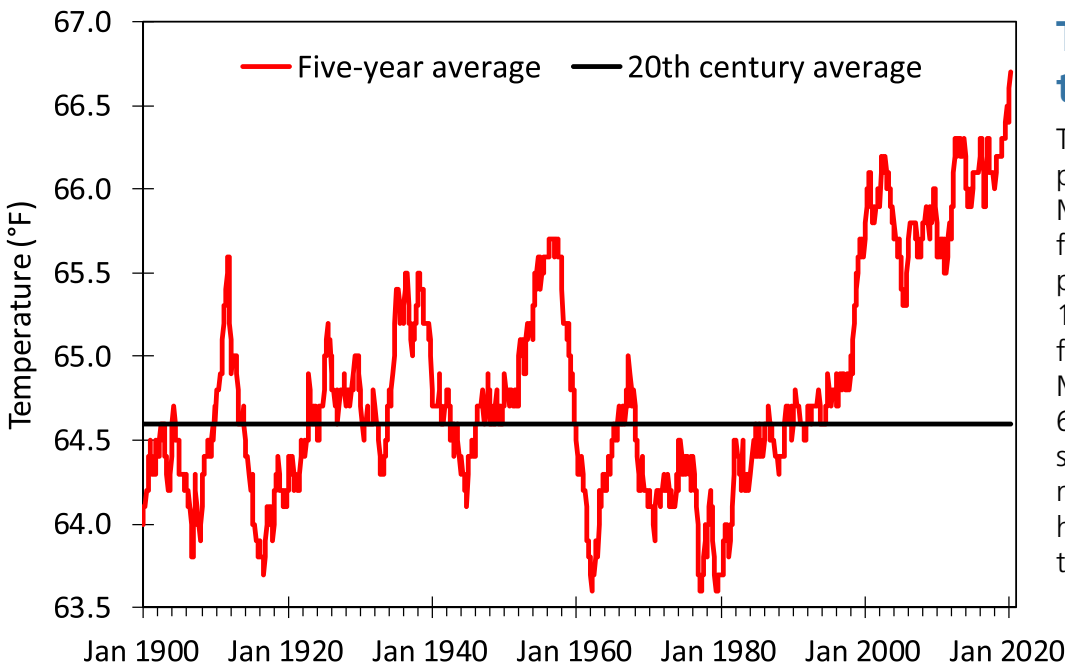
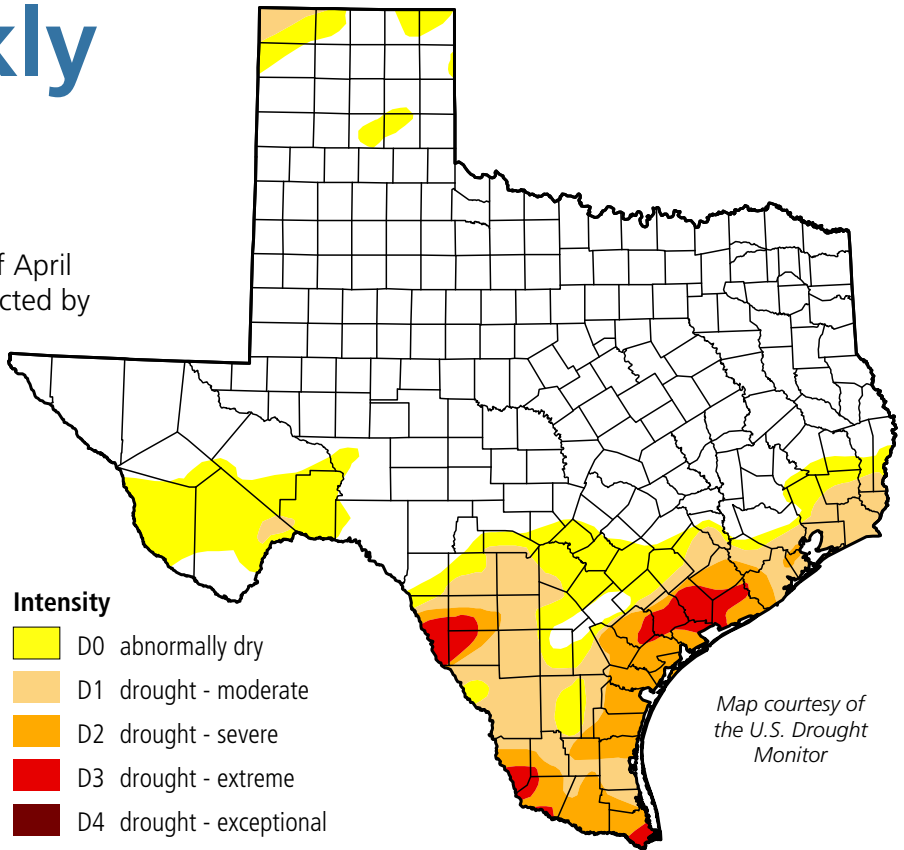

## Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of April 21 shows no change in the total area impacted by drought. However, exceptional drought was eliminated from the state, and the area impacted by severe or worse drought dropped one percentage point and now covers 7 percent of the state.

## Drought conditions

- ◆ 16% now
- ◆ 16% a week ago
- ◆ 35% three months ago
- ◆ 1% a year ago



## Texas temperature

The five-year (60-month) period ending with March 2020 set a record for the hottest five-year period for Texas since 1895. Temperatures from April 2015 to March 2020 averaged 66.7°F across the state, one degree more than during the hottest five years of the 1950's drought.
