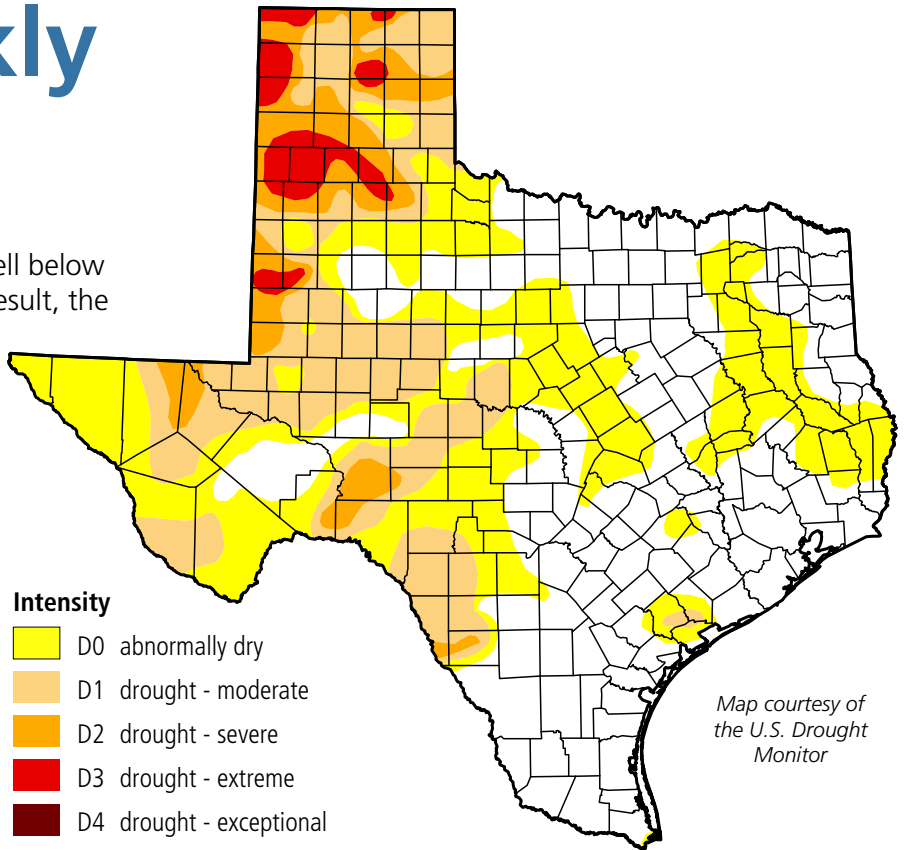

## Water conditions

During the past week, precipitation was well below normal for more than half the state. As a result, the latest drought map for conditions as of June 30 shows continued expansion and intensification of drought. The area of the state impacted by drought reached its highest value since mid-February 2020.

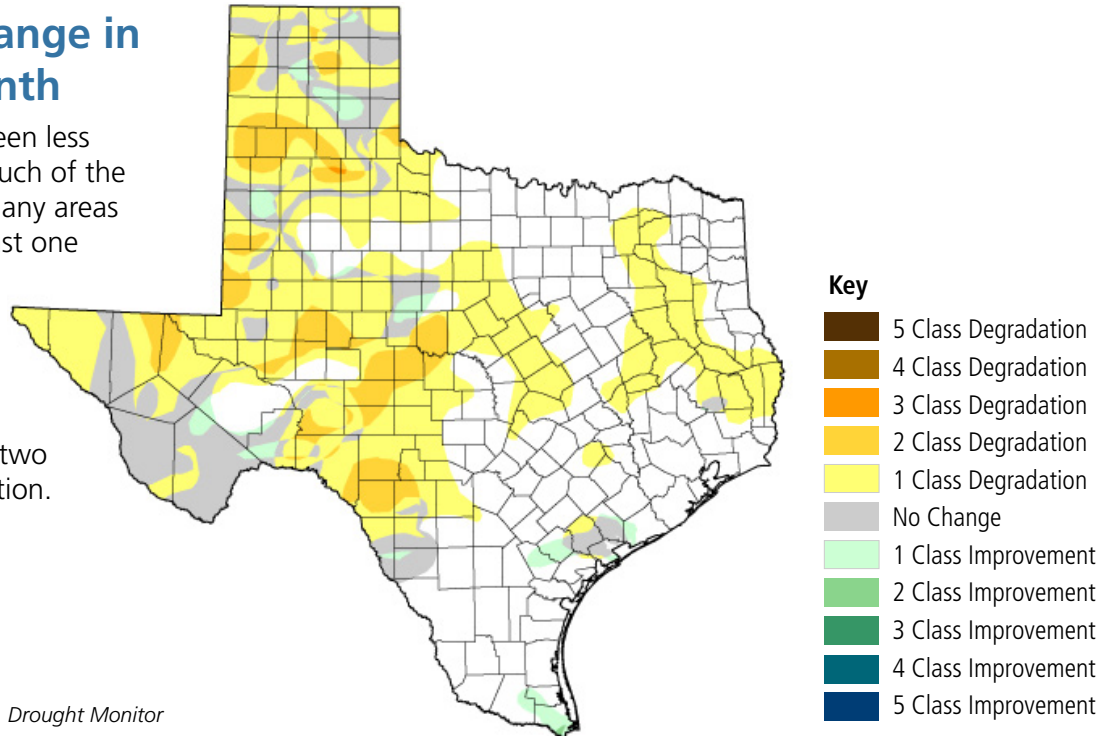
## Drought conditions

- ◆ 28% now
- ◆ 25% a week ago
- ◆ 20% three months ago
- ◆ 1% a year ago



## Drought change in the last month

June rainfall has been less than normal for much of the state, leading to many areas experiencing at least one class of drought degradation. Some areas of the Panhandle and Central and West Texas experienced two classes of degradation.
